ABOUT THE 6:8 FREEDOM PROJECT

This fall, JOY International is launching a comprehensive homeschool curriculum to educate and engage children and teens in the fight against human trafficking. Based on Micah 6:8, the curriculum will provide a faith-based, age-appropriate look into trafficking around the world, while encouraging students to discover their own passions and gifts to make a difference. Your donation supports the development of a quality curriculum for millions of students around the world.

THE CURRICULUM

The 6:8 Freedom Project will consist of 12 video segments with variations based on age group with appropriate content available for grades 1 to 12. Each video will consist of a lesson, including real-life stories and footage from around the world along with a memory verse that will be discussed and tied to the video lesson.

A Freedom Workbook will be made available to all students participating in the curriculum. The Freedom Workbook includes age-appropriate activities and opportunities for reflection based on each video segment.

Homeschooling has experienced rapid growth over the past few years, especially within the United States. Current estimates indicate approximately 5.5 million students are engaged in homeschooling in the U.S.

In a recent report, the United States Census Bureau's Household Pulse Survey (published in April 2021), cited these statistics as being representative of the diversity of U.S. homeschoolers.

- Hispanic: 12.1% of households are homeschooling
- White: 9.7% of households are homeschooling
- Black: 16.1% of households are homeschooling
- Asian: 8.8% of households are homeschooling

While data is somewhat limited, it is estimated that approximately 2/3 of homeschool families are Christian which positions The 6:8 Freedom Project to be an attractive resource to the majority of homeschool families.



DISTRIBUTION



The 6:8 Freedom Project will be made available online for free for any family or classroom interested in learning more about human trafficking.

Initially, the curriculum will be heavily promoted by Sonlight, a well-established Christan homeschooling community and curriculum resource that has been connecting homeschool families with a love for lifelong learning for over 30 years.

JOY International will also promote the curriculum through partnerships with other homeschooling networks as well as through our supporting churches, community groups, and donors.



IMPACT

The 6:8 Freedom Project will bring much-needed awareness and understanding to the plight of children, teens, and young adults impacted by human trafficking. Through the curriculum, children and teens will not only engage in learning but will be prompted to actively participate in the fight against human trafficking as well. Through the Freedom Workbook activities that accompany each lesson, students will be invited to serve within their local communities and hopefully discover their own passions and gifts to make a difference.

Through Sonlight's partnership, students will be encouraged to fundraise for JOY International as a part of their participation in the curriculum. At the end of this fundraising period, Sonlight will match the funds raised, setting the stage for a remarkable opportunity for JOY International to raise a significant amount to fund our work to fight human trafficking.

ABOUT JOY INTERNATIONAL

JOY International was founded in 1981 by Dr. Jeff Brodsky. In 1981, while reading the Scriptures, (Jeff says he was "readin' the red") he came across the verse in John 15:11 where Jesus spoke these words: "I speak these things to you so that My JOY would be in you and that your JOY would be complete." It was on that day that God gave him the vision for the ministry of JOY International with the idea of sharing the JOY of Jesus and establishing children's homes in places around the world wherever he found suffering children. His sincere desire was to search for "the least of these."

In more recent years, Dr. Brodsky's eyes were opened to a burgeoning evil against children. An evil that is an abusive exploitation of the world's most innocent and vulnerable children. This atrocity has radically refocused his heart and the original vision of JOY International. It is an atrocity that has quickly become a 150 billion dollar industry according to the latest United Nations Trafficking In Persons (T.I.P Report). It is the fastest growing crime in the world today of Child Trafficking or the Commercial Sexual Exploitation of Children (CSEC).

MISSION

JOY International is dedicated to the rescue, restoration, and reintegration of children, teens, and young adults affected by trafficking and the prevention of human trafficking, especially the trafficking of children, worldwide.

VISION

Our vision is to see each captive set free from a life of slavery to experience the true joy of reaching their greatest potential in every area of life.

JOY INTERNATIONAL'S VALUES

SEEK JUSTICE

We are tenacious, determined, and resilient in our pursuit of freedom for enslaved and trafficked persons. We are consistent, prioritizing long-term success over short-term gain. We advocate for the oppressed and enslaved while honoring them as autonomous and unique individuals made in God's image. We honor survivors by not exploiting their stories, honor others by not publicly criticizing them, and honor the Lord in our words and deeds. We are marked by integrity, we are transparent and do the things we say we will do.

LOVE MERCY

We work from rest, prioritize Sabbath, and guard against burnout through personal health and self-care. We prioritize the health and relationships of our own families first, understanding that building a better world starts in our own homes (what good is it to gain the world but lose your soul, what good is it to "save" others but lose our families?). We are quick to forgive when other organizations, co-workers, partners, or clients fail us or wrong us.

WALK HUMBLY

We collaborate and cooperate with others. We understand that we cannot do this work alone. We are humble, we understand that we do not always have the best answers, thus we rely on each other and our partners to complete our work. We are honest with our limitations, using our "No" to prioritize the things we have said "Yes" to. We know that we do not save anyone, (only God can save), we simply partner with His ongoing work in the mission that He has given us. Our faith is the core of who we are and is emphasized by our reliance on God.
